I. Summary of Position

This position is an entry-level supervisory role for an experienced water treatment technician. Oversee the Consolidated's water treatment operator team, train, monitor, advocate processes improvements for the team, and perform routine operational and skilled technical work with the equipment, processes, and systems to report and advise on treatment performance, and activities of targeted complexity with latitude for independent judgment in moderately structured work.

II. Supervision Received

Works under the direct supervision of Superintendent of Water Treatment and the indirect supervision of the Chief of Operations & Maintenance.

III. Supervision Exercised

Supervisory duties are applicable. Managing a team of plant operators at varying skill levels.

IV. Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Monitor and inspect water treatment equipment, processes, and performance by planning, communicating, training, and reviewing systems, materials, and the environment to ensure quality operation and management. Detect or assess problems, make recommendations and corrections, and evaluate to ensure optimum quantity quality; control the process, systems, instrumentation; and compliance with environmental and public health standards.

- Ensure appropriate selection, training, management, and evaluation of direct reports
 by organizing and leading plant operators of different skill levels to operate efficiently
 while encouraging and building mutual trust, respect, and cooperation among team
 members.
- Guide and motivate direct reports by setting standards, monitoring performance, and providing coaching and encouragement through relevant, timely feedback to develop and retain the best talent.
- Expand and maintain a solid knowledge of the industry developments by identifying
 opportunities and changes in circumstances or events related to the water treatment
 industry to apply new knowledge, skills, or abilities on the job and foster greater

- Intermediate ability, management knowledge, and leadership experience of identifying

the underlying principles, reasons, or facts by acquiring and evaluating data to interpret into meaningful patterns for informing, optimizing, correcting, and validating information and performance.

- Solid ability, advanced knowledge, applied theory of problem sensitivity, logic and reasoning, and sound judgment and decision making to materialize novel ideas and solutions to complex challenges, even in the face of ambiguity.
- Basic ability, common knowledge, and fundamental awareness and understanding of psychomotor competency concepts, preparation, performance, and maintenance technique requirements to perform the physical demands of this position.

- o physical strength in exerting maximum muscle force to lift, push, pull, or carry materials
- must wear standard protective gear and safety equipment every day due to exposure to contaminants and hazards
- o listens to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences; hear sounds and other indicators
- Advance read and understand written information and ideas presented in writing;
 work in glare or low lighting conditions; color differentiation, depth perception,
 near vision, and focus
- Convey information and ideas in oral and written expression so others will understand

This position works throughout the various facilities of the treatment plant complex, including indoors, in an environmentally controlled setting, and outdoors exposed to weather conditions. Some exposure to contaminants, hazardous work conditions and equipment, and sounds or noise levels distracting or uncomfortable. Occasional overtime, shift duty, emergency on-call, and irregular hours (i.e., holidays, weekends) are required.
